St-John's Baptist- Church.

This Church was constituted on the 15th day of June 1851, with eight members dismissed from the Goose Ercek and Mount Olive Churches, by the Rev. C. M. Breaker and the Rev. Samuel Lifnes.

Covenant.

Thereas it is the incumbent dutif of those who are favoured with the dispensation of the grace of God, to embrace his covenant acknowledge his dovernment, profess his name, and unite together in the faith and fellowship of the fospel: The whose names are herwinto annexed, do now, as in the presence of the Great Elemal God who knows the secrets of all hearts, and in the presence of Amount of and in the presence of Amount and then, acknowledge ourselves to be under the most solume obligations to be the Lords; and we do solomnly covenant and agree:

1. That we will take the Only Living and Frue God: On God in Three Persons: Father, Soh, and Holy Thost; to be our God.

2. We unreservedly and solemnly five up ourselves, both some and body, and all we possess. We Almighty God; to be ordered, directed, and disposed of by him, according to the counsel of his holy will: And this we do, in an humble dependence on the grace of the Holy Spirit to aid and support us in the sacred endoffements; and hoping for acceptance and salvation through the merit and mediation of our Lord Josus Christ.

3. We take the Scriptims of the Old and New Testament, to be our sule of faith and practice, both in the great concerns of fion, and the general affairs of life; and particularly for acting the business of the Oldrech.

Covenant.

We promise to maintain communion and fellowship with each other, in the public worship of God, according to the various redinances of the Gospel; "not foraking the assembling ourselves of other, as the manner of some is;" but embracing all requires, convenient seasons for this purpose as the providence of od shall permit. And that we will exercise christian forbearnice and love, one towards another; praying for, and sympatorical with each other, in the various aircumstances of life, and sind every landable endeavour to provoke to love and food

I. We promise individually, to pay a respectful regard to the dvice and admonitions of the Church, and to be subject to its discipline, as directed by the word of God, and conducted in the spirit of the Goopel.

6. We promise to contribute in a reasonable manner, according to it ability, for the support of public worship, and the relief of the poor in the Church; and to use our influence, to forward not promote the interests of the Redeemer's kinddom in the world. That we will be careful to conduct ourselves with up-ofteness and integrity, and in a peaceful and friendly women, downerd mankind in general, and toward serious bristians of all discriptions, in particular. That we will also any a conscientions regard to civil dovernment, and five it or support, as an ordinance of God.

And this covenant we make with the free and full onsent of our souls, hoping through sich, free, and undless grace, we shall therein be accepted of God, unto al life through Jesus Christ our Lord. To whom by flory and ty, hower and dominion, everlasting. Amen.

Immediately after the constitution of the Church the Members assembled for business. The Conference was ordanized by electing Brother D. M. Breaker, Moa erater, and Brother John H. - (5) St. John's Baptist Church. This church was constituted on the 15th day of June 1851, with eight members dismissed from the Goose Creek and Mount Olivet Churches by the Rev. D. M. Breaker and the Rev. Samuel Lynes. Covenant. Whereas it is the incumbent duty of those who are favoured with the dispensation of the grace of God, to embrace His covenant, acknowledge His government, profess His name, and unite together in the faith and fellowship of the gospel. We whose names are hereinto annexed, do now, as in the presence of the Great Eternal God who knows the secrets of all hearts, and in the presence of Angels and Men, acknowledge ourselves to be under the most solemn obligations to be the Lord's, and we do solemnly covenant and agree: 1. That we will take the Only Living and True God, One God in Three Persons: the Father, Son and the Holy Ghost to be our God. 2. We unreservedly and solemnly give up ourselves, both soul and body, and all we possess, to Almighty God: to be ordered, directed and disposed by Him according to the counsel of His holy will: And this we do, in an humble dependence on the grace of the Holy Spirit to aid and support us in the [se] sacred engagements, and hoping for acceptance and Salvation through the merit and mediation of our Lord Jesus Christ. 3. We take the scriptures of the Old and New Testament, to be our rule of faith and practice, both in the great concerns of [torn] and the general affairs of life, and particularly for transacting the business of the Church.
- (6) Covenant. 4. We promise to maintain communion and fellowship with each other, in the public worship of God, according to the various ordinances of the Gospel, "not forsaking the assembling ourselves together, as the manner of some

is," but embracing all regular, convenient seasons for this purpose as the providence of God shall permit. And that we will exercise Christian forbearance and love, one towards another, praying for and sympathizing with each other, in the various circumstances of life, and using every laudable endeavor to provoke to love and good works. 5. We promise individually, to pay a respectful regard to the advice and admonitions of the Church, and to be subject to its discipline, as directed by the word of God, and conducted in the spirit of the Gospel. 6. We promise to contribute in a reasonable manner, according to our ability, for the support of public worship, and the relief of the poor in the church, and to use our influence to forward and promote the interests of the Redeemer's Kingdom in the world. That we will be careful to conduct ourselves with uprightness and integrity, and in a peaceful and friendly manner, toward mankind in general, and toward serious Christians of all descriptions, in particular. That we will also pay a conscientious regard to civil government, and give it our support, as an ordinance of God. And this covenant we make, with free and full consent of our souls, hoping through rich, free and boundless grace, we shall therein be accepted of God, unto eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. To whom, by glory and [torn], power and dominion everlasting. Amen.

(7) Minutes. June 15th, 1851. Immediately after the constitution of the Church, the members assembled for business. The conference was organized by electing Brother D. M. Breaker, Moderator and Brother John W. Walling, Clerk pro tem. The following resolution was then offered by Brother W. J. Dennis, and carried unanimously. 1. Resolved, that the Rev. D. M. Breaker be invited to accept the pastoral charge of the church. Brother Breaker replied in a few appropriate

remarks expressing his pleasure the pleasure he felt in receiving such marked display of the esteem of his Brethren, and concluded by accepting the call. 2. Brethren Dennis and Walling were then chosen deacons of the Church to serve on trial for one year, and at the expiration of that time, if the Church be satisfied with their qualifications, to be publicly ordained to that office. 3. It was agreed to defer the election of a regular clerk to some future meeting, and to record all proceedings of the Church, until such election was made by a clerk pro tem. The following resolution was then offered by Brother John W. Walling and carried. 4. Resolved, that the conferences of the Church be quarterly, on the Saturday before the first Sabbath in June, September, December and March, and that wherever anything shall transpire...

(8) MINUTES. between these meetings, demanding the immediate attention of the Church, notice shall be given the Pastor who shall call a special meeting which shall have all the power of a regular conference. The conference then adjourned to meet on the Saturday before the first Sabbath in September. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. John W. Walling, Clerk pro tem. September 1851. The Church met in conference. The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. Brother Breaker took the chair and Brother John W. Walling, elected pro tem. The following Preamble and resolutions were then offered by Brother Walling and carried. Whereas, previous to all organizations of our Church we were connected with the Charleston Association of the Churches to which we then belonged, and whereas we are anxious that the relation should be renewed in our present union, and that our Church become a member of that Body. Therefore 2.

Resolved, that our Pastor be requested to write a letter to that body praying

admission into their membership, and that the and Brother Walling be appointed to represent us in the next meeting of the association.

- (9) Minutes. 3. The importance and desirability of erecting a suitable house of worship was then taken into consideration, and after due consultation the following resolution was offered by Brother Dennis and carried. Resolved, that Brother D. M. Breaker be requested to act as agent for the Church in collecting subscriptions for building a house of worship and that he report to the Church as a sufficient amount is secured to warrant a commencement. 4. The meeting then adjourned to the Saturday before the first Sabbath in December. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. John W. Walling Clerk pro tem. December 1851. 1. The Church met in conference, and after organizing in due form, read the minutes of the last meeting, and proceeded to business. 2. Brother M. P. Walling was then proposed and elected general Church Clerk and entered upon the duties of his office. 3. Brother Breaker reported that he had obtained pledges to the amount of \$200, whereupon it was agreed to make a commencement forthwith and Brethren Dennis and John W. Walling were appointed a committee to draft a plan for the building...
- (10) Minutes. ...and report immediately. 4. The committee hastily sketched a draft and submitted it to the Church. The plan was for a neat frame building 30 feet square, walls 13 feet high, roof half hipped, three doors and fourteen windows with comfortable seats. The whole to be of the best materials and finished in a workman-like manner. The plan was adopted and ordered to be the basis of a treaty with a builder. 5. Brethren Dennis, John W. Walling and Lewis Rush were appointed to engage a builder if possible and report at the next meeting. 6.

Brother Breaker was requested to communicate with the Honorable Mr. Cain with a view to securing a lot of land in some convenient place for the Church, and report at the next meeting. 7. A motion for adjournment was then offered and carried, and conference adjourned to the Saturday before the first Sabbath in March 1852. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. W. P. Walling, Church Clerk. March 1852. The Church met for business. The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. 1. The committee appointed to make arrangements for employing a builder reported that they had not been able, up to the present time, to secure one, and...

(11) Minutes. asked further time, which was granted. 2. Brother Breaker reported that in accordance with a request of the Church he had entered into negotiation with Mr. Cain, and had obtained a lot, one-fourth of a mile below the Village of Pinopolis on the main road passing through the Village, and that Mr. Cain had given a perfect Title to the Church for the same. 3. The lot was accepted and Brother Breaker appointed to present the sincere thanks of the Church to Mr. Cain for his generous bestowment. 4. The meeting then adjourned to the Saturday before the first Sabbath in June. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. June 1852. The conference met. Read minutes of last meeting and proceeded to business. 1. The committee appointed to engage a builder were not prepared to report and asked for still further time. Granted. 2. The following preamble and resolutions were then offered and carried. Whereas, the probation of the deacons-elect of our Church is not expired, and the Church feels confidence in the qualifications of those brethren. Therefore...

- (12) Minutes. 1. Resolved, that the deacons be publicly ordained on the third Sabbath in the present month. 2. Resolved, that the Reverend E. M. Breaker and Reverend Samuel Lynes be invited to assist our Pastor on the occasion. Nothing more claiming the attention of the meeting. Adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. September 1852. The conference met and being duly organized proceeded to business. 1. The committee charged with the duty of contracting with a builder for the erection of a house of worship reported that they had used every effort to secure the services of a builder, but had signally failed in every instance, and that they believed it would be impossible to get the house built for less than \$300, a sum considerable above the entire amount subscribed, whereupon 2. On motion, it was resolved, the committee endeavor to ascertain the smallest amount for which the house can be built and report at next meeting, and that Brother Breaker requested to increase the subscriptions as far as possible.
- (13) Minutes. 3. The appointment of delegates to the association was then taken up, and Brethren Breaker and John W. Walling were appointed. A motion for adjournment then obtained and after prayer by Brother John W. Walling, adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. December 1852. They met in conference and after the usual preliminary services proceeded to business. 1. The committee on building reported that Mr. J. L. Driggers had proposed to take the contract for \$275. 2. On motion, resolved that the contract of building the Church be given to Mr. Driggers, and that the committee be authorized to enter into such arrangement with Mr. Driggers as shall secure the building of the church according to plan, and in as short a time as possible. The

meeting then adjourned. Prayer by Brother Breaker. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk

- (14) Minutes. March 1853. The Church met in conference. Prayer by Brother Breaker. Read and confirmed minutes of last meeting. No business coming before the church. After prayer by Brother M. P. Walling, adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. June 1853. In consequence of the inclemency of the weather, there was no meeting. September 1853. The Church met. Prayer by Brother John W. Walling. 1. The committee on the building of the Church reported that the house was finished according to plan and ready for use.

 2. On motion, resolved, that the Church be received, and paid for, and the committee be discharged. Resolved, that the [purposely blank] Sabbath in [purposely blank] be set apart for the consecration of the Church and that the Reverend James E. Hinton, and the Reverend Samuel Lynes be invited to meet

with us at that time and assist in the ceremonies.

(16) Minutes. 3. Brethren Breaker and John W. Walling were then appointed delegates to the association, after which the meeting adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. December 3rd, 1853. The Church met in conference. Brother Breaker prayed. Read the minutes of the last meeting. 1. Brother Hugh B. Smith presented a request through the pastor desiring a letter of Dismission for himself and wife, Sister Susan Smith, in order to connect themselves with the Goose Creek Baptist Church near to which they had moved. Granted. Nothing more coming up. Adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. March 4th, 1854. The Church met in conference and after

the usual preliminary services, proceeded to business. 1. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. 2. Brother Breaker presented the letter of dismission

- (17) Minutes. ...given by this church at last conference to Brother H. B. Smith and Sister Susan Smith for the purpose of uniting with the Goose Creek Baptist Church, and stated that this Brother and Sister had, from the recent tolerance of dancing among its members, became unwilling to connect themselves with their Church, and begged to have the membership restored to this, which was granted.
- 3. The question being raised as to the propriety of Christians engaging in dancing, and it being known that, in the absence of any rule directly forbidding it, some of our members had felt themselves at liberty to indulge in this amusement. It was thought well that this Church should make some expression on the subject and the following Preamble and Resolution offered by Brother Walling was accepted.
- 4. Whereas there exists among our members a difference of opinion as to dancing, in consequence of which some of our Brethren engage in the practice to the serious injury of the feelings of those who believe it improper, therefore, to settle the question. Resolved that dancing is a practice, altogether and in every way, inconsistent with a profession of religion, and, therefore, shall not be any longer allowed among out members. The conference then adjourned. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. D. M. Breaker, Moderator
- (18) Minutes. June 3rd, 1854. The church met for business. The conference being formed in order proceeded as follows: 1. Read and confirmed minutes of last meeting. 2. The following Preamble and Resolutions were then offered and unanimously adopted. Whereas it has pleased an all wise Providence to remove

from our number Brother William J. Dennis, and thus deprive this church not only of a valued member, but also of a faithful deacon. Therefore 1. Resolved, the while we mourn under this affiliating Dispensation, it is our duty to submit patiently to the will of our Heavenly Father, and to endeavor to replace the post thus made void. 2. Resolved, that the church meet in conference on the first Sabbath in next month for the especial purpose of choosing a brother to the office of deacon. The meeting then closed. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk

- (19) Minutes. July 2nd, 1854. Agreeably to appointment the church met for the purpose of selecting a deacon. Brother Breaker read portions of scripture in which the qualifications of a deacon are expressed, and, made a short address to the church, after which the blessings of God were sought in prayer and, the election made, where upon Brother M.P. Walling was chosen to serve on trial for 1 year. Adjournment. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. Minutes. September 2nd,1854. The church met in conference. Prayer by Brother Breaker.
- 1. Read and, confirmed the minutes of last meeting. 2. Appointed Brethren John W. Walling and, M.P. Walling to represent us the next meeting of the Charleston Association. Brother Breaker to write the letter. The conference then adjourned.

(20) At the request of several brethren, the Church was called together on the 3rd Sabbath in October 1854, when information was given of a quarrel between Sister Hanah M Lindsay on the one part, and Brethren Jns. W. Walling and M. P. Walling and Sisters Sarah M. Walling and Anna J. Walling on the other part, arising from certain injuries supposed to be done to the former by the latter. The case being a

very difficult one, and involving so many of the members of the church resolved to defer action, and invite the assistance of some brethren from the nearest Sister Churches; and appointed the 5th Sabbath in the trial of this case 1. In accordance with the above arrangements, the Church met in conference on the 5th Sabbath in Oct. 1854. The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. 2. The following Brethren appeared from Sister Churches in answer to the invitation of this church: John McCullers & Samuel Lynes, from Goose Creek, J.W. Easterling and Jns. Baylor from Mount Olivet, and Peter Huxford, Sr. from Wassamasaw. 3. Bro. Huxford was invited to take the seat as moderator, and Bro. Easterling requested to act as clerk. 4. The case was then called, and H. Lindsay arose and stated that Brethren J.W. & M.P. Walling and Sisters Sarah M & and Ann J. Walling had conspired with some other persons (21) Minutes. to publish a certain piece of writing called a "Bulletin" in which her name was scandalized, and, further, that the Brethren Wallings had allowed their nephew to maltreat her son, a boy, very much under his size, and refused to give satisfaction when it was demanded. 5. The first charge was, upon investigation was found groundless; And with respect to the latter the Brethren stated that the general facts were true, but they gave no allowance or permission to such conduct on the part of their nephew, and neither of them being properly his Guardian, that they did not suppose that they had the right to give the satisfaction demanded. The Conference, however, decided that they were bound for the conduct of their nephew so long as he lived in their house, and required them to make apologies, which being done, the contending parties took each

other's hands in friendship, and after prayer by the Pastor of the Church, the conference adjourned. Peter Huxford, Sr., Moderator. J. W. Easterling, Clerk (22) Minutes. December 1854. 1. The Church met in conference, and the minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed. 2. No business coming before the Church. Adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Clerk. March 1855. 1. The Conference met. Read and confirmed minutes of last meeting. 2. Nothing claiming the attention of the church. Adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Clerk. June 1855. 1. The Conference met, and after reading and confirming the minutes of last minute proceeded to business. 2. Brother M. P. Walling, Deacon-elect, was unanimous - being called to Ordination, and the Pastor requested to invite the Reverend James E. Hinton and the Reverend Samuel Lynes to aid in the same on the third Sunday in this month. (23) Minutes. 3. Nothing more claiming attention, adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. 1st Sunday in July 1855. The Reverend D. M. Breaker having called the church to order stated that he had had the misfortune to be forced into a personal combat with Mr. J. C. Tharin of Grumsville, and desired a public trial of the case before the church, and further requested that the ministers and members of all the surrounding churches meet with the church as early a day as possible for that purpose. The agreed to propositions and directed the secretary to invite the Brethren as above. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. In accordance with the above arrangements, a meeting of the Church, with Brethren C. M. Breaker, Peter Huxford, Jr., and J. J. Browning of the Wassamassaw Church convened on Sunday the 19th of August 1855. 1. The Reverend C. M. Breaker was chosen Moderator and J. J. Browning, Clerk. 2. The

purposes of the meeting being explained by the moderator, on motion of Brother Huxford, resolved that the on account of the very small...

- (24) number in attendance: (no brethren answering the call from the other Sister Churches) this meeting will not proceed to hear the matter, but will adjourn to meet again at this place on the first Lord's day in September, and that the Brethren from the Goose Creek, Wassamassaw, Mount Olivet, and the St. Stephen's Churches be earnestly requested to meet with us on that day to hear and determine the matter. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. J. J. Browning, Clerk. 1. An adjourned meeting of the St. John's Baptist Church was held according to appointment on the first Sabbath in September 1855, with the Brethren from the following churches, to wit, Wassamassaw, C. M. Breaker, Peter Huxford Sr. and J. J. Browning -- Mount Olivet --Peter Huxford Jr. -- Goose Creek -- Samuel Lyons and John McCullers. 2. Brother Lynes was chosen Moderator and J. J. Browning continued as clerk. 3. The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed, when Brother D. M. Breaker, being called upon, gave a full and concise statement of the affair, and all the circumstances connected therewith: which was fully corroborated by Brother McCullers, and also submitted the following certificate, which was ordered to be recorded with the minutes.
- (25) Minutes. "Grumesville July 28th, 1856 [1855]" "We the undersigned were present when an altercation occurred between J. C. Tharin, Esq. of Grumesville Reverend D. M. Breaker. Mr. Breaker was first assaulted with blows and acted entirely on the defensive. After a few blows, the parties were separated and the matter of difficulty was immediately and amicably adjusted. (Signed) Lawrance W. Belsch, John McCullers, J. L. Poppenheim, James Acock, H. Nichols" 4. After a

careful consideration of the matter, it was on motion of Brother C. M. Breaker, unanimously Resolved, that, this meeting discovers nothing in the conduct of Brother D. M. Breaker that merits censure and that we continue to him of esteem and confidence. After which the meeting finally adjourned. J. J. Browning, Clerk. Samuel Lynes, Moderator

- (26) Minutes. December 1855. There was no meeting. March 1856. Brethren Breaker and J. W. Walling present. June 1856. The Church met in conference. Read and confirmed the minutes of the last meeting. 1. Brother D. M. Breaker offered his resignation of the Pastoral Church of the, giving satisfactory reasons for his course. The Church after due consideration, reluctantly consented to accept his resignation and appointed the 3rd Sabbath in this month for the purpose of calling another minister and then adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Moderator. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. 1856. The church met, confirmed the minutes of last meeting Brethren present: John W. Walling, M. P. Walling, and E. C. Bunch...
- (27) and John N. Williams. Called Brother P. Huxford, Senior to preach for us. After some consideration he accepted the call, he only being a licentiate it became necessary for him to be ordained. We therefore invited Brethren to form a presbytery and appointed to set him apart by ordination. The meeting then adjourned. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk. 1856. The Church met in conference, confirmed the minutes of last meeting. Brethren present: Reverend D. M. Breaker, Reverend James E. Hinton, Reverend Peter Huxford, Jr., and Brethren J. W. Walling, M. P. Walling, E. C. Bunch, J. N. Williams with Sisters. The candidate

having given entire satisfaction proceeded to ordination. The meeting then adjourned. M. P. Walling, Church Clerk

- (28) Minutes. 3rd May 1857. A special meeting being called. Brethren present: Reverend P. Huxford, Sr., Reverend D. M. Breaker, J. W. Walling, M. P. Walling and E. C. Bunch. I received a letter from Sister S. A. DeHay requesting an investigation of her case. Appointed the first Saturday in June for said business and ordered the Clerk to invite the assistance of the Goose Creek Church, Mt. Olivet, St. Stephen and the Wassamassaw Church. And the following Brethren from Charleston, viz. B Manly, D. D. and J. R. Kendrick, B. C. Pressley and James Tupper. The conference then adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Church Clerk Pro Tem. June 1857. Meeting postponed until the first Saturday in July. July 4th, 1857. A regular conference met. Brethren present:
- (29) Reverend P. Huxford, Sr., J. W. Walling, M. P. Walling and E. C. Bunch. The following Brethren appeared from the Wassamassaw and Mt. Olivet Churches. viz. Thomas W. Easterling and Richard DeHay. 1. The conference was organized by Brother Huxford being called to the Chair & D. M. Breaker Clerk. 2. The case of Sister S. A. DeHay was then taken up. Brother J. W. Walling submitted in proof of the first marriage, the affidavit of William Bartlett and John J. Boyden, who swore that Mr. DeHay and Miss Boyden of Charleston were married on the thirteenth day of November A.D. 1847 and a certificate from the said lady to prove that no divorce had ever been authorized or signed by her, also his personal testimony that the said lady is still living. In proof of the second marriage the certificate of the Reverend William B. Yates of Charleston who certified that Mr. DeHay and Mrs. Dennis were married by him on the tenth day of April 1855. And the affidavit

of Anna C. Thornley, who swears that the said parties married in her presence on the date above named. After some debate a motion was made to postpone the final action of the church to a subsequent date.

(30) Sister DeHay objected to such arrangement and urged for a final decision. It was visited on the part of some of the brethren present that to defer the action on this subject would give Sister DeHay a better opportunity to defend herself against said charges to which however she still strongly objected but instituted certain enquiries suggestive of positive doubt of the validity of the testimony adduced. Where upon the Church resolved to defer the action to the Saturday before the first Sunday in November, next. And the Brethren before invited, be again invited to be present and aid in our deliberations. The meeting then adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Church Clerk Pro Tem. October 30th, 1857. A regular conference met. Brethren present: Reverend P. Huxford, Sr., Reverend D. M. Breaker, J. W. Walling, J. N. Williams and Brother G. Lynes from the Goose Creek Church who was invited who also took the chair. The minutes of the last meeting read and confirmed. The case of Sister S.A. DeHay was then taken up in... (31) addition to the evidence before submitted. The certificate of the Reverend D. Derrick was presented by Brother Breaker after much consideration the church resolved to appeal to the association for help. The meeting then adjourned. D. M. Breaker, Church Clerk Pro Tem. December 22nd, 1857. A special conference met. Brethren present: Reverend P. Huxford, Sr., D. M. Breaker, J. W. Walling, E. C. Bunch together with a committee appointed by the Charleston Association consisting of the Reverend J.R. Kendrick, Reverend E. T. Winkler and Brother James Tupper was held on the date above mentioned for the purpose of

investigating the case of Sister S. A. DeHay and also of taking into consideration the propriety of the dissolution of the Church. The meeting was organized by the election of Brother James Tupper as moderator and D. M. Breaker Clerk. After hearing the evidence in the case, the committee retired for consultation and after a few moments returned with the following report which...

- (32) was unanimously adopted viz. The committee appointed to confer with the St. Johns Church in reference to the difficulties connected with the case of Mrs. DeHay after having heard the evidence recommend 1st. That Mrs. DeHay be excluded from the membership of the church. 2nd. That if in due course of law Mrs. DeHay establishes her claims to the amount advanced by her former husband for the erection of the church edifice that application be made by the church to the association for aid in liquidating the debt. 3rd. That in the hope that this settlement will ensure the church a greater prosperity for the future than it has heretofore enjoyed we recommend to the church that its existence shall be maintained for the present and if after a reasonable time the result desired is not attained, then we recommend dissolution. 4th. And lastly, that in view of the fact that every good and perfect gift cometh from above and that God's blessings must be sought in the diligent use of the meaning of grace. We recommend to the church that a special season of prayers and other...
- (33) religious services be appointed by them and that they invite the missionaries of the association to them aid in such meeting. (Singer) James Tupper, Chairman. J. R. Kendrick, E. T. Winkler. October 17th, 1858. A special conference met. Brethren present: Reverend P. Huxford, J. W. Walling, E. C. Bunch, Moses Jackson, Morgan Jackson, J. L. Whitfield with Sisters Olive Bunch, M. L. Hyott, M. Thornley,
